### **Anna Coyajee-van Rietschoten**

- Commodore of the Kuala Belait Boat Club (KBBC)
   since August 2012
- Passionate about the Borneo wildlife, in particular about hornbills
- Creator of the popular Brunei Memory Game and Brunei wildlife cards

How did you get involved in the KBBC activities? How long have you been doing it? Tell us a bit about this part of your life in Brunei.

Well, I arrived in Brunei in April 2012. I quit my job and came here as a trailing spouse not really knowing what to expect but willing to explore. I've always liked sailing, so I quickly joined the KBBC sailing activities. They happened to run a sailing course. After I showed I knew how to sail I was offered to join in as a sailing instructor. At first I was a bit shocked as I had limited experience with the types of boats they were using (Hobie Cat 16) but then I thought "Why not? I can try". So that is how I started to be an active KBBC member and met new people. Shortly after I went to a KBBC committee meeting. Quite soon the then commodore started looking for a successor as he was about to move, and in August 2012 I took over the role. I became the first female commodore. All the previous KBBC commodores were men employed by BSP.

In the beginning I relied quite a bit on the help of the then vice-commodore who was a BSP employee. It worked really well, as I could ask him many questions and rely on his assistance and experience. In the course of time I developed my own way of running the KBBC and its subsections. I learned my politics, I learned how things worked... Yeah, I learned on the job. Now, more than 5 years later, it feels like I know so much already. For outsiders being the KBBC commodore might seem as a difficult and challenging position. But it is not just me. We have a great board (vice-commodore, secretary, treasurer, house member, etc.), and we all work together to support the KBBC and its subsections.

Being the KBBC commodore means being a volunteer and working with volunteers. Working




with volunteers means that nobody has a clear job description. As the commodore I do have certain responsibilities. I aim for a good ratio of running lots of activities and having as little meetings as we can. Volunteers should not do lots of KBBC-related admin work, as they have enough admin work as a spouse or as an employee! We have a long record of organizing activities but with people coming and going - as is the case in an expat community - it always depends on the active members that are around. But it may take up to half a year before a new subcommittee settles and starts working independently. For the last regatta I did not have to do anything, as it was fully organized by the Sailing subcommittee members.

As the KBBC commodore I participate in the Panaga Club management committee meetings. I represent all the KBBC subsections the same way as other people represent Tennis, Golf, Tri-Fit, Yoga, Swimming, the Panaga Natural History Society (PNHS), the Panaga Library, etc. Typically at the KBBC we charge a small fee to cover operating costs (maintenance of boats, kayaks and SUPs), and all the assets and investments are covered by the Panaga Club and BSP. Sometimes my work includes the need to do a bit of lobbying, a bit of playing, a bit of talking to people... and we get things done!

# Next to running the KBBC you have been active in bird watching and studying hornbills.

But how nice is it when these beautiful birds are in your garden! And it fits my background. I am a medical biologist. I did a PhD in





I've been so lucky to have had so much time to develop my hornbill project. The PNHS has a long track record of people (volunteers mostly) involved in conservation of hornbills and other wildlife on the BSP property. In 2014 Iwan de Lugt asked me if I wanted to take over his task of watching hornbill nests and nest boxes that existed around the Panaga camp. Sure, I had the skills to do it but Brunei also gave me opportunities. First I got interested in hornbills, and then I started studying them. At some point I realized that people wanted to hear more about this topic, so I gave a talk at Outpost. After that I became more confident about my experience and started giving





small lectures in schools here in Brunei. At some point I even went to a hornbill conference in Kuching. I am used to going to conferences, but not in this field. And then it turned out that I was the only one from Brunei and suddenly I became "the expert", "the hornbill lady". I am happy to see that now the Panaga community is much more aware of this topic and is more attentive to hornbills. We are planning to organize a Hornbill Day early next year.

#### What do you like most about your life here?

I've discovered how nice it can be to live in a small community. I have mostly lived in Amsterdam where you are much more anonymous. Here in Brunei I met people that I would have never met otherwise. This small community gives you opportunities to hang out and do things together with people so different from yourself.

Plus, I love having this nice big garden and having the jungle so close by.

#### What do you like least about your life here?

The distance from and the time difference with the Netherlands. I don't like making appointments to have a call. That does not work for me. So I have to work to keep in touch with my family and friends by other means. My parents could only come here once, which was great and a big memory to treasure. Nowadays for

them it is just too long to travel all the way to Brunei again.



#### What is your typical weekend in Brunei?

I like to spend Friday nights at home with my family. On Saturday mornings we usually go to the Panaga Library with the kids. There we often meet pretty much the same group of people, and it is always nice to catch up with each other. Quite often there is also a kids party, a horseback riding lesson or a social function to go to.

On Sunday mornings at 9 o'clock there is the Dutch swimming lesson at the Panaga Club pool. It is a great tradition and a good way for our children to get their A, B and C swimming diplomas. While kids are in the water parents can have their coffee and talk about life (in Brunei) and the party of the night before.

Sometimes I help my children with their homework. Sometimes we play music exercises together. Then we prepare for the week and have a nice dinner together at home.






This is Borneo! Here is the jungle! I made a couple of wonderful private trips here on the island.

Here in Brunei I managed to discover my passions, and luckily I had opportunities to pursue them.


#### What advice would you give to newcomers?

Don't be afraid to show initiative. Don't be afraid to talk to people. Just do it! Try to contribute to projects even if in the beginning you are not familiar with the topic. Meet new people; Participate in different activities and committees. You don't always have to commit to big and long-term projects, but don't be afraid to try new things and to contribute in your own way.

Try to see the positive sides of living here. Try not to complain. See the opportunities. Every place will have things you can complain about. Try to be positive. You need to be positive if you want to work together with people, and working with positive people is so much better!

As a non-employed partner in Brunei you sometimes have to create your opportunities. You do need to have initiative and be enthusiastic. First you might see a niche, then you develop it, then you gradually get people to help you out with it, and in the end you end up with something really beautiful! And then you realize that it is not getting more complicated than that. Sometimes you hear people complaining about not being able to work here. But work does not have to be paid by money; It can be paid by reward. This community can give you a lot of rewarding experiences.

How do you see your life after the Brunei adventure is over? Things are quite different here in Brunei from how they are, for







example, in the Netherlands. There a regular paid job would be part of a normal life for me. In the Netherlands I would eventually find work based on my new experience. I feel like I won't go back to how things used to be 5 years ago, as I have moved on. From there I will continue to explore.

At the moment I find it hard to predict what happens because I don't know where we will be going to next year. But I think I've managed pretty well here in Brunei, so I have the confidence that I can adjust and adapt easily and have a positive experience anywhere. Once we know where we will be moving to it will get exciting as well.

For now I am focused on making a good handover of the KBBC activities and on organizing another hornbill project before we leave Brunei.




