# FUNDRAISING EVENT FOR Pusat Ehsan Al-Ameerah Al-Hajjah Maryam

Panaga Bazaar, a fundraising event promoted and organized by Outpost, took place last Saturday 6th Oct 2018. This meaningful event intended to raise funds for Pusat Ehsan Al-Ameerah Al-Hajjah Maryam - Kuala Belait branch - a non-government organization, which provides education, rehabilitation and training programs for children and adults with special needs.

Pusat Ehsan needed funds to build a new classroom to improve education, intervention and rehabilitation services already offered by the center including various physical rehabilitation schemes aimed at restoring and promoting physical fitness.

The Outpost Focal Point, Celyn Lim together with her team of volunteers from the Panaga community managed to attract a crowd of more than 200 participants including local Belait residents to the occasion. With strong support from Dr. Ceri Powell, BSP's Managing Director, who opened her residence to host the event, the afternoon was filled with live music by The Casual Ceilidh Band and DJ Kip Green, prize draws from sponsors and performances from children from Panaga School and Panaga Dance Centre (PDC). Several vendors from the Belait district co-sponsored the event and offered their products for sale. Pusat Ehsan students performed a special song under direction of Hjh Mimah (Pusat Ehsan's person in charge) to the arriving guests.

With the support of the Panaga communities, sponsors, tickets and raffle ticket sales by the Outpost team and all guests who visited the event, the total raised for Pusat Ehsan reached \$10K, double of the target initially set by the team.

### Travelogue Mougolia



As I'm sure most of you would agree, one of the best things about living in South East Asia is the proximity to so many fantastic travel destinations. When my husband and I were looking into possible destinations for our next trip back in the spring of this year, I can't say that Mongolia was on the top of my list. But we were looking for an exotic place to go, and we wanted to spend our time away doing something active and outdoorsy, and after some research of places to go that would tick all of the boxes Mongolia is where we ended up!

We spent approximately two weeks in the Mongolian "wilderness" in the end of June. The trip did take some preparation, a lot of it being preparation of the mental variety, as it - at least for me - felt a bit strange travelling to such as remote location. It did however turn out to be one of the best travel experiences ever. There are a few tour operators specializing on adventure trips in Mongolia. We travelled with the tour operator Mongolia Fixers, a small but very professional and engaged team, which we really recommend.









### Travelogue Mougolia

Our trip was divided into two parts and was all pre-planned with the help of a tour operator. During the first part we spent the days kayaking down the long, beautiful river Delger Murun in pack rafts, together with two guides and one other tourist. We kept to a leisurely pace and in this way really had time to take in the fantastic landscapes. We hardly ever saw any people, except for the occasional herder tending his cows, yaks or sheep. We spent around five to six hours in the rafts each day, only stopping for lunch by the river side. At the end of the day we met up with the two drivers and the cars carrying the bulk of the gear and set up camp for the night. The camping experience in itself turned out to be a lot more comfortable than we had expected, as the tour included - besides the two guides - a chef and two drivers. This very friendly and helpful team made sure that we had nice hot meals every night, plus cooked breakfast every morning. Apart from the one night when temperature sank below freezing and the two evenings where strong winds made the tents fill up with sand the camping was truly enjoyable.

The second part of our trip started with the whole group driving up to Lake Khövsgöl to enjoy a few days in relative civilization. Lake Khövsgöl is one of Mongolia's biggest tourism attractions, both for local and foreign visitors. It holds almost 70% of Mongolia's fresh water and 0.4% of all the fresh water in the world. The water is amazingly clean - but cold! We stayed in traditional (however probably a bit more lavish than normal) yurts, and among other things went scuba diving on a wreck.

After the stay at lake Khövsgöl my husband and I continued with only one driver - the forever smiling Bagi, and the chef - Jagi, to explore a bit of the countryside by ourselves. The fact that we brought the tents made sure we were very flexible on where we could go, and Bagi's four wheeled truck could handle all the roads and - lack thereof - we encountered. We spent days on the road back to Ulaan Baatar. During

these final days of our trip we – among other things – stayed in a ger, ate traditional food and went sheep herding on horseback, we hiked up the dormant volcano Khorgo Mountain and stopped by the Terkhiin Tsagaan Nuur Lake, also called "White Lake". We also spent many hours in the cars, just driving through expanses of relatively empty landscape. To be honest, that part was probably one of my favorites, as this landscape is just fantastic and driving through it meant that we really could appreciate how vast it is. Hour after hour of big sky, rolling hills and never ending grass. And an enormous amount of livestock!

Due to some delay in our flights we didn't end up spending a lot of time in the capital, Ulaan Bataar, but I don't think that was a huge loss, to be honest. If you want to visit Mongolia you should do it because of the nature, and the silence and calm you can experience there.

If you are interested hiking and other outdoors activities I would highly recommend Mongolia. The nature is stunning, and a lovely contrast to the lush jungle we are used to here in Brunei. When we were there, in June, the temperature was mostly pleasant, ranging from 20-30 Celsius degrees during the days, but far lower temperatures in the nights. We experienced only a few hours of rain during our stay - generally the summers in Mongolia are very dry. I. would highly recommend traveling with a tour operator rather than going by yourself, as there are several areas where you need permits to visit and camp, and that whole business didn't seem to be all that straight forward to arrange if you are not used to the Mongolian bureaucracy or if you don't know the language. At the least I think traveling with a Mongolian speaking guide is advised.


